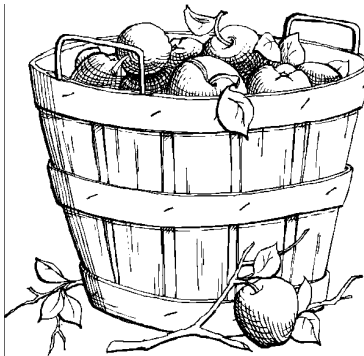

"Give back to Ceaser what belongs to Ceasar - and to God what belongs to

God."

Jesus lived the whole of his life in an occupied country. The Romans were probably not such an immediate presence in Galilee, leaving its control to their puppet king Herod Antipas, but their presence in Jerusalem was much more evident, their main garrison being attached to the Temple Mount, much to the chagrin of the Jews. The question put to Jesus by the Pharisees, who were no lovers of the Romans, was devious. If Jesus says the Roman taxes should be paid, he can be accused of being a traitor to his country. If he says they should not be paid, he can be accused of being a rebel and handed over to the Roman authorities.

As ever, Jesus avoids the direct answer and takes the question to another level. The story of Cyrus, who freed the Jews from their exile in Babylon, is just one example from biblical history of God makes use of Gentiles for the good of God's people, Jesus, however, uses the Roman coin to make a distinction we would think of today as that between the secular and the spiritual. The head on the coin is that of Caesar, so give him back his coin. But we are made in the image and likeness of God, and that is what we should be paying attention to.

APPLYING TODAY'S GOSPEL

Our identity is intimately bound up with God. What does that mean? In the book of Genesis it says God made human beings in God's own image and likeness, "male and female he created them". The first element in our identity is being male and female. This is an appeal to use our male and female qualities to work together to imitate God in God's creativity.

The second element of our identity with God, is that God hands over to us the stewardship of the world, and ask us to carry it out as creatively as God demonstrated himself. This is initially illustrated by our being asked to name all that surrounds us, the plants, the animals, the natural world. In modern ecology we are discovering the full depths of this responsibility, a sensitivity more often held by other traditions. God is creator and sustainer; God is healer and inspirer. God loves the world and loves us. Our challenge is to discover whether we can love in the same way as God loves.

"Devuelve a César lo que pertenece a César, y a Dios lo que pertenece a Dios".

Jesús vivió la totalidad de su vida en un país ocupado. Los romanos probablemente no tenían una presencia tan inmediata en Galilea, dejando su control a su rey títere Herodes Antipas, pero su presencia en Jerusalén era mucho más evidente, su guarnición principal estaba unida al Monte del Templo, para disgusto de los judíos, La pregunta que le hicieron a Jesús los

fariseos, que no eran amantes de los

romanos, era tortuosa. Si Jesús dice que se deben pagar los impuestos romanos, se lo puede acusar de ser un traidor a su país. Si él dice que no deberían ser pagados, puede ser acusado de ser rebelde y entregado a las autoridades romanas.

Como siempre, Jesús evita la respuesta directa y lleva la pregunta a otro nivel. La historia de Ciro, que liberó a los judíos de su exilio en Babilonia, es solo un ejemplo de la historia bíblica de Dios hace uso de los gentiles por el bien del pueblo de Dios, sin embargo, Jesús usa la moneda romana para hacer una distinción que pensaríamos de hoy como eso entre lo secular y lo espiritual. La cabeza de la moneda es la de César, así que devuélvele la moneda. Pero estamos hechos a imagen y semejanza de Dios, y eso es a lo que deberíamos prestar atención.

APLICANDO EL EVANGELIO DE HOY

Nuestra identidad está íntimamente ligada a Dios. ¿Qué significa eso? En el libro de Génesis dice que Dios hizo a los seres humanos a imagen y semejanza de Dios, "varón y hembra los creó". El primer elemento en nuestra identidad es ser hombre y mujer. Ciertamente, es un recurso para usar nuestras cualidades masculinas y femeninas para trabajar juntos para imitar a Dios en la creatividad de Dios.

El segundo elemento de nuestra identidad con Dios es que Dios nos entrega la mayordomía del mundo y nos pide que lo llevemos a cabo tan creativamente como Dios se demostró a sí mismo. Esto se ilustra inicialmente cuando se nos pide que nombremos todo lo que nos rodea, las plantas, los animales, el mundo natural. En la ecología moderna estamos descubriendo las profundidades de esta responsabilidad, una sensibilidad que muchas otras tradiciones tienen. Dios es creador y sustentador; Dios es sanador e inspirador. Dios ama al mundo y nos ama. Nuestro desafío es descubrir si podemos amar de la misma manera que Dios ama.
