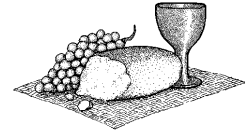

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“Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?”

In today’s Gospel Peter asks Jesus about forgiveness. Jewish tradition limited forgiveness to three times, so Peter thought his willingness to forgive seven times would be regarded as generous. Peter’s questions indicated that he still wanted to count how many times he should forgive. Jesus is, in effect, telling him not to count. Jesus stresses the importance of forgiveness, that a person cannot expect mercy from God if there hasn’t been the same generosity of spirit demonstrated to others. He uses the parable of the unmerciful servant to urge forgiveness and mercy. As we say so often in the Lord’s Prayer, “forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us”. Jesus talks about forgiving seventy seven times, but it’s not the mathematics that matters. What Jesus describes is vast and cosmic, a forgiveness

permeating all creation, making all things new. Refusing to forgive will make it and experience for us to understand and experience the generous forgiveness of God for us.

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APPLYING TODAY’S GOSPEL

The Roman philosopher Seneca wrote: “The sins of others are before our eyes, our own are behind our backs”. We all know we should forgive, but that doesn’t mean it’s easy to do, especially when a person has wronged us in a terrible way. Withholding forgiveness can cause a toxic cloud to hang over our lives and prevent us from truly finding joy. Refusal to forgive can consume the heart and drain the energy. Forgiveness does not tolerate revenge. Learning to let go and forgive will heal our souls and help us to find happiness in this life. Experiencing God’s generous mercy transforms who we are and the way we see our lives. We can recognize the blessings given to us. We cannot heal ourselves by clinging to our wounds. And neither can we contribute to the repairing of the world without practicing forgiveness.

The practice of forgiveness can both soften our heart and transform the world community. We often hear about peace processes in various countries. In every case, each party must listen sympathetically to the stories of the other, overcome misunderstandings and exaggerations, recognize its own misdeeds and begin to forge common links. The spirit of forgiveness is essential for the preservation of human community, whether in the home, the neighborhood, the nation or the world. The strongest motive is the realization of our own great need of forgiveness and of the extremes to which God has gone in order to bring us the healing we need. C.S. Lewis said: “To be Christian means to forgive the inexcusable because God has forgiven the inexcusable in you.”

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¿No tenías compasión de tu compañero como yo tuve compasión de ti?

En el Evangelio de hoy Pedro le pregunta a Jesús sobre el perdón. La tradición judía limitó el perdón a tres veces, por lo que Pedro pensó que su disposición a perdonar siete veces sería considerada generosa. Las preguntas de Pedro indican que él todavía quería contar cuántas veces debía perdonar. Jesús, en efecto, le está diciendo que no cuenta. Jesús subraya la importancia del perdón, que una persona no puede esperar misericordia de Dios si no ha demostrado la misma generosidad de espíritu hacia otros. Él usa la parábola del siervo despiadado para pedir perdón y misericordia. Como decimos tantas veces en la Oración del Señor, "perdona nuestras ofensas, como también nosotros perdonamos a los que nos ofenden". Jesús habla de perdonar setenta y siete veces, pero no es la matemática lo que importa. Lo que Jesús describe es vasto y cósmico, un perdón que impregna toda la creación, haciendo nuevas todas las cosas. Rehusarse a perdonar hará que sea una experiencia para que nosotros entendamos y experimentemos el generoso perdón de Dios por nosotros.

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APLICANDO EL EVANGELIO DE HOY

El filósofo romano Seneca escribió: "Los pecados de los demás están ante nuestros ojos, los nuestros están detrás de nuestras espaldas". Todos sabemos que debemos perdonar, pero eso no significa que sea fácil de hacer, especialmente cuando una persona nos ha ofendido de una manera terrible. Retener el perdón puede provocar que una nube tóxica cuelgue sobre nuestras vidas y nos impida encontrar alegría verdaderamente. Rehusarnos a perdonar puede consumir el corazón y drenar nuestra energía. El perdón no

tolera la venganza. Aprender a dejar ir y perdonar sanará nuestras almas y nos ayudará a encontrar la felicidad en esta vida. Experimentar la generosa misericordia de Dios transforma lo que somos y la forma en que vemos nuestras vidas. Podemos reconocer las bendiciones que se nos han dado. No podemos sanarnos aferrándonos a nuestras heridas. Y tampoco podemos contribuir a la reparación del mundo sin practicar el perdón.

La práctica del perdón puede ablandar nuestro corazón y transformar la comunidad mundial. Con frecuencia escuchamos acerca de los procesos de paz en varios países. En cada caso, cada parte debe escuchar con simpatía las historias del otro, superar malentendidos y exageraciones, reconocer sus propias fechorías y comenzar a forjar lazos comunes. Tener un espíritu de perdón es esencial para la preservación de la comunidad humana, ya sea en el hogar, el barrio, la nación o el mundo. El motivo más fuerte es la realización de nuestra propia gran necesidad de perdón y de los extremos a los que Dios ha ido para traernos la sanidad que necesitamos. C.S. Lewis dijo: "Ser cristiano significa perdonar lo inexcusable porque Dios ha perdonado lo inexcusable en ti".
