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**"Why be envious because I am generous?"**

Immediately prior to the Gospel we hear today, Jesus tells Peter, in response to the encounter with the rich young man that "the first will be last and the last will be first". Peter has asked the question "What about us? We have left everything and followed you." In the parable of the workers in the vineyard, Jesus attempts to drive home the message that all will be treated equally by God. Jesus gives an unflinching teaching on the generosity of God, whose ways are not our ways.

In the parable, the men who have been employed for the day line up to receive their wages. One would expect that those who have worked longer would receive more than those who have worked less. This seems to be a fair way of doing business; however, this is not the case. The landlord (representing God) gives the same to the last as the first, and stresses that those employed at the beginning of the day have no reason to be envious; after all, their payment has been agreed. This surely is just; an agreement has been made and the landowner is then entitled to do what he sees fit with anyone else. Scholars tell us that one denarius (dollar) would have been sufficient to feed a large peasant family for one day. The landowner, from the start, has been good to the workers he hired at the beginning of the day. To those who hired later, he says he will give a "fair wage"; they do not know what they will receive, but the landowner is true to his word and gives them plenty.

The message here is that God will look after all of us in the same way; we will all be provided for generously.

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**APPLYING TODAY'S GOSPEL**

Reflecting on the parable of the workers in the vineyard, it's easy to imagine anger being sparked in the minds of those employed at the beginning of the day. Scrunched-up fists; furrowed brows; stomping of the feet in frustration; next stop perhaps, fire coming out of the top of their heads. The word "envious" in the Gospel is translated from a Greek word that means to give an evil look of resentment towards another. That is a strong emotional reaction - simmering anger. There are times in life when we will meet situations where there seems to have been an injustice and our reaction may be the same. We have to be clear though, there is no injustice in today's parable; an agreement had already been made. The story demonstrates that God is entitled to reveal His mercy whenever and wherever He wishes.

In Parishes and in other church communities, we all have different experiences of coming to or deepening in faith. Sometimes it may be that a new member of the Christian community is suddenly getting involved in lots of different ministries. The whispering begins: "Who does he (or she) think they are?... he (or she) has only been here for 5 minutes!!!" This is dangerous territory; a misplaced sense of injustice turns to idle gossip and, as Pope Francis said, "The devil destroy with the tongue, with idle chatter that divides."

Today we are invited to reflect on how God chooses to reveal mercy and love according to His own plan. God's love is free and is offered to all; we all come to know his at different times. A heart open to this beautiful truth will surely rejoice in both early and late comers.

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### **¿Por qué ser envidioso porque soy generoso? "**

Inmediatamente antes del Evangelio que escuchamos hoy, Jesús le dice a Pedro, en respuesta al encuentro con el joven rico que "los primeros serán los últimos y los últimos serán los primeros". Pedro hizo la pregunta "¿Qué hay de nosotros? Hemos dejado todo y te hemos seguido". En la parábola de los obreros de la viña, Jesús intenta resaltar el masaje que todos serán tratados igualmente por Dios. Jesús da una enseñanza sobre la generosidad de Dios, cuyos caminos no son nuestros caminos. En la parábola, los hombres que han sido empleados para el día se alinean para recibir su salario. Uno esperaría que aquellos que han trabajado más tiempo recibirían más que aquellos que han trabajado menos. Esto parece ser una forma justa de hacer negocios; Sin embargo, ese no es el caso. El propietario (que representa a Dios) da lo mismo a los últimos como a los primeros, y subraya que los empleados al principio del día no tienen razón para ser envidiosos; después de todo, su pago ha sido acordado. Esto seguramente es justo; se ha hecho un acuerdo y el propietario tiene entonces derecho a hacer lo que crea conveniente con cualquier otra persona. Los estudiosos nos dicen que un denario habría sido suficiente para alimentar a una gran familia campesina durante un día. El propietario, desde el principio, ha sido bueno con los trabajadores que contrató al principio del día. A los que contrataron más tarde, dice que dará un "salario justo"; ellos no saben lo que

recibirán, pero el dueño de la tierra es fiel a su palabra y les da abundancia. El mensaje aquí es que Dios nos cuidará a todos de la misma manera; todos seremos proporcionados generosamente.

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### **APLICANDO EL EVANGELIO DE HOY**

Reflexionando sobre la parábola de los obreros de la viña, es fácil imaginar la ira que se despierta en las mentes de los empleados al comienzo del día. Puños hacia arriba; cejas surcadas; pisoteo de los pies en frustración. La palabra "envidioso" en el Evangelio se traduce de una palabra griega que significa dar una mala mirada de resentimiento hacia otro. Esa es una reacción emocional fuerte - cólera fría. Hay momentos en la vida en que nos encontramos con situaciones donde parece haber habido una injusticia y nuestra reacción puede ser la misma. Tenemos que ser claros, sin embargo, no hay injusticia en la parábola de hoy; ya se había concertado un acuerdo. La historia demuestra que Dios tiene derecho a revelar Su misericordia siempre y donde quiera. En Parroquias y en otras comunidades eclesiales, todos tenemos diferentes experiencias de llegar o profundizar en la fe. A veces puede ser que un nuevo miembro de la comunidad cristiana se involucre de repente en muchos ministerios diferentes. El susurro comienza: "¿Quién piensa que es? ... él (o ella) sólo ha estado aquí por 5 minutos !!!" Este es territorio peligroso; un sentido equivocado de la injusticia se convierte en chismes ociosos y, como dijo el Papa Francisco, "El diablo destruye con la lengua, con la charla ociosa que divide".

Hoy estamos invitados a reflexionar sobre cómo Dios escoge revelar misericordia y amor según su propio plan. El amor de Dios es libre y se ofrece a todos; todos vienen a conocer la suya en diferentes momentos. Un corazón abierto a esta hermosa verdad seguramente se alegrará tanto en los primeros como en los recién llegados.
